## Birds


Take a look at the learning suggestions and then choose some things to explore. You don't have to do everything.

- If you have some wool you could make some pom-pom birds.
- Research a particular bird and make a poster or fact file about it. Birds of prey are really amazing but so is the humble sparrow.
