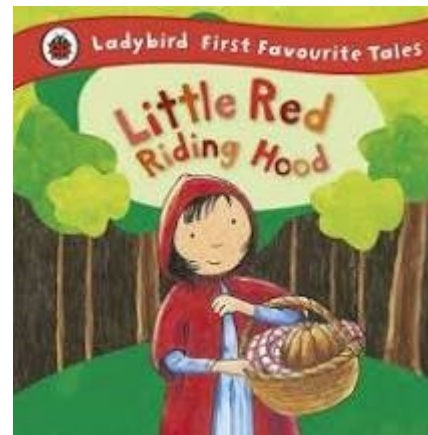


This half term our theme is 'traditional tales'. This week we are focussing our learning on the tale of **Little Red Riding Hood (LRRH)**

Communication & Language

- Describe a character from the tale and see if a family member can guess who it is.
- Play a game of 'I spy' using a page from the book.
- Listen to an audio book version of the story. You can find one here
- Talk about how the different characters may feel in the tale.
- Think of some adjectives to describe what Riding Hood might see, hear, smell and feel in the woods.



Literacy

- Create a story map for the tale.
- Retell the tale using the story map.
- Think about what LRRH might have in her basket when she visits her Granny. Make a list of the items you can think of.
- Can you write some sentences to say why she might have each item?
- Pretend you are LRRH. Write a letter to Granny

Expressive Arts and Design

- Design a new cape for Little Red Riding Hood
- Make and decorate some biscuits for Granny.
- Create some salt dough biscuits and food to add to a role play game.
- Make a model woods of different trees and plants.

Maths

- What shapes can you see on the pages of the tale?
- Draw a map to show how LRRH can get to Granny's cottage.
- Create a number story: start with 10 things in the basket and on the way to Granny's, what could happen which means she loses the things? Talk about 1 less each time.

Understanding the World

- Use Purple Mash to create your own traditional tale.
- Go on a woodland walk and collect leaves, twigs, pebbles etc for you to create a mini woods of your own.
- Talk about your families and who is special. Maybe post them a card.

Physical Development

- Move your body like one of the characters.
- Create an outdoor obstacle course for a journey to Granny's house.
- Decorate a bucket to be the wolf. Throw small balls or beanbags in as if you were feeding the wolf.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Little Red Riding Hood stopped to talk to the wolf. Do you think this was a good idea? Talk to your grown up about your ideas and about what you think she should have done.
- Set up a Granny's house role play area.
