The theme for the next two weeks is **the natural world**. Hopefully you have been inspired by your learning from last week about the different biomes and places in the world – we'll now be looking in more detail in our science and art lessons at plants and other aspects of nature.

Today's number of the day is the number 11. What can you tell me about this number? How many different ways can you make it? Use all 4 operations if you can (+, -, x, ÷) Can you draw it using different representations? When in everyday life might you come across the number 11? Can you think of any songs, books or films that have the number 11 in them?

English

I have continued to record chapters of 'The Girl of Ink and Stars' as an audio book so you can listen to them, or you can read through the rest of the book at your own pace. I have now produced a big resource of activities linked to the book and I would like you to pick and choose from this 'menu' each day for the next two weeks to work on any of the things that take your fancy. You might find that you can complete one activity a day, but you may also find that some take you several days to do in depth. **You don't have to do everything** – you choose what you do and how long you spend on each task – take responsibility for your learning and take pride in your work. This week's **spelling activities** are all on one file. Do one page every day if you can. If you are unable to print things out at home, I know that the word-searches are tricky. However, you can all do the second part of each sheet in your exercise book, even if you can't print the first part. If you can do it all, then that's great!

Maths We're carrying on the work on ratio and proportion this week. Today's lesson is continuing work on scale factors. If you've forgotten what we did last time, look back over that first! Then, open the file, 'Monday maths' to find instructions for where to find today's work.

Mrs Phelps has again produced some ideas and resources for our art lessons this week and next week. Again, I am going to suggest that art takes place on a Monday and a Friday, but you can choose to do it on another day in the week if you prefer.
