The lyrics go quickly, but see if you can spot these: 'photosynthesis is how plants take in light from the sun and turn it into energy'; 'chlorophyll cells take in carbon dioxide...combine it with water and exposes it to sunlight, and that's how plants can make their own food'; 'through photosynthesis plants make oxygen and humans need oxygen to breathe'. Listen to it a few times and you'll have it running through your head all day!
