### Appointment of Deputy Headteacher

We are delighted to formally inform you now, that in July from a strong pool of highly qualified applicants, including Acting Headteachers, we appointed a new Deputy Headteacher for Thomas Bullock School, due to begin in January. Please see a note to families from Mr Nick Wade introducing himself.

## FOREST SCHOOL

In Forest School Mrs Garrod has been working with years 1,2,3 and 4. They have all explored the Forest School area in rain and sunshine. "Rain won't stop us!"

We have played several games using animals to get to know each other and help Mrs G remember names: iguanas, lions and mountain goats being among the animals the children chose.

They have been learning about fires – how to make them, light them and stay safe around them. The children also learned about the Science of fire and the three things they need to work. This also helps them learn how to extinguish a fire! We have cooked marshmallows on sticks over the fire too – a most important skill to learn.

We have looked at shelter design with Y3 and Y4 and discussed ways to make a waterproof shelter. Some ideas were very complicated and we look forward to trying them all out.

The children have also been looking at some of the wildlife present in the school grounds – different birds, insects and even a toad (which had climbed a tree!)

It's been great to see the children ready and prepared for the sessions with wellies and waterproofs. They can really enjoy all seasons when they are ready for any weather!



## **Music Tuition**

Music Teachers from The Norfolk Music Service have been coming in each afternoon to teach music across all year groups. Below is a summary of what the children have been learning from their music teachers.

Years 5 and 6 are learning samba drumming and have been concentrating on the key elements of music, rhythm and pulse through a variety of activities away from the instruments as well, which are essential for samba skills. They have been learning about the origins of Samba, where it comes from as well as watching musicians from Brazil in short videos.

EYFS have been learning how to play a steady beat on different parts of their body and trying out their own ideas. They have been moving the bodies to a steady beat in a song and pretended to be shoes, a Jack-in-the-box, a swing, a slide and a seesaw. They have been using their voices to make high and low sounds and faces to make happy, sad, tired and surprised expressions along with lots of dancing and actions to stories and rhymes.

Years 1 and 2 have been exploring sounds, performing body movement to a steady pulse. They have performed the Mashed Potato chant with hand actions and clap in time to a steady beat. They have been learning to chant and clap word rhymes using fruit names and to create their own ostinati. They have just started to play word rhythms on the Djembe drums.

Years 3 and 4 have been enjoying learning to play ukuleles.
