Nursery Fee Reduction

Last week, we mentioned that we were looking to decrease our Nursery fees for our excellent teacher-led provision due to the current financial climate. From the Summer term, we will only charge £4 a session, reducing the fee by 95p per session. Our sessions always include lunchtime- we do not charge for this half-hour for any child.

We are still taking enrolment for the Summer term and from September. We also intake from the Age of 2 and accept 15 and 30 hour funding.
