Oceania Class (yr 1)

Year One's Science topic is all about 'Plants'. After last week's outdoor hunt for different types of plant, this week, we dissected a beautiful petunia in the name of Science. We reassembled it on some card and labelled the basic parts of the plant whilst finding out each of their special jobs.









Africa Class (yr 2)

In Science we have been investigating "What is inside a seed?" We dissected both dry and wet seeds to examine the seed coat and seed leaves.







Europe Class (yr 3)

In Science this week the class set up their bean investigation, to understand the importance of the different things that plants need to grow. In History the children have been exploring Ancient Greek artefacts.

It has been a hot one! We've managed to keep cool with lots of learning in the shade, water play and even the odd ice lolly! We've continued practising our word building skills during phonics. We've consolidated our learning surrounding our focus book 'Come on, Daisy'. The children have particularly loved this book and learning about the moral of the story! They made actions for the story, helped to make a giant story map and used this to orally re-tell the story — lots of the children could re-tell the story almost word for word! We were introduced to number lines in maths and have completed various activities practising 'What comes after?' too. During our afternoons, we did some RE learning, explored insects further, explored our outdoor areas, completed a range of art activities and made an obstacle course around our outdoor area!



Next week

Next week is World Insect Week!

We will continue recapping our RWI sounds, building words, reading words and learning red words. We will begin our literacy learning about 'Little Red Riding Hood'. We will look at 'What comes before?' in maths. We will extend our doctors role play further, explore looking after insects and animals, continue our RE learning, learn more about sun safety and look at where a range of insects live! Our art will focus around drawing and painting animals from our focus stories.

Learning links at home

- When you spot numbers in the environment around you, for instance door numbers on the way to school, identify them! What comes after that number?
- Sing counting rhymes that recite the numbers in order, e.g. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 Once I Caught a Fish Alive or One, Two Buckle My Shoe. Pause what number comes next?
