Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of Thomas Bullock

This week in school I have been lucky to spend time in class seeing how are children are settling into learning, transitioning into their new class setting and welcoming new friends. This is always a joy, especially as we watch our own Nursery children confidently move into Reception alongside children from other settings who have just joined our school. I was most impressed to see the depth and quality of writing, already being produced in Year 6 yesterday. They are off to a flying start!

I thought I would share a few additions to our team and the wealth of skills and knowledge they bring to our school.

#### Ms Wylie

Ms Wylie, working with us in Breakfast Club each morning and as the Year 1 Teaching Assistant, joins us as a Qualified Designated Safeguarding Lead and Early Years SENCO. Many of our children already know her as she worked in another setting as a Nursery Manager prior to completing training for Primary Settings. Ms Wylie has an excellent level of EYFS and KS1 curriculum knowledge and we are delighted she has joined our team. Please do give her a wave at the gate!

## Mr Weston

Mr Weston, who joined us at the end of the year, as a teaching assistant in Year 3, is also a qualified sports (and soon to be swimming) coach and again many of our children will know him from his sessions as a Rugby and Football coach. Mr Weston has supported Teaching and Learning for a number of years and is also undertaking his Teaching Degree over the next few years. We are delighted he has agreed to bring his rugby training to our school this year and is leading a KS1 Rugby Session on Monday's and KS2 Rugby Session on Tuesday's after school.

Next week we will be interviewing for a further teaching assistant following our summer advertisement. We had a huge number of qualified applicants with high academic standards for the KS2 post and will inform the community as soon as we have made a permanent decision.

# REMINDERS

#### Uniform and general appearance

Thank you for following our school uniform, the children looked smart and prepared on their return. # The Ark Nursery Newsletter





The children are settling in fantastically, making new friends and enjoying all of our classroom resources! They have met lots of our lovely staff and explored our school and all of our outdoor areas.

Alongside singing many nursery rhymes and reading many stories, we have begun our focus on the book 'The Colour Monster'. Within this, we have discussed feelings and what they might look and feel like, whilst matching them to the colours we are learning about in maths! We've also talked about times when we

might feel happy, sad or angry. We've look at ourselves in mirrors – pulling faces and noticing the features of our faces. We then had a go at mark making for our self-portraits! We will compare these with future self-portraits to see how our mark making changes.

We were also introduced to our date, birthday, weather and special events display and took our first photo of what we can see when we look outside of our classroom. Over the year, we will compare these monthly photos and talk about the changes we can see.



Next week

Our learning will continue to centre around the story of 'The Colour Monster' where we will continue to talk about feelings and explore colour and colour mixing. We will play lots of speaking and listening games, sing lots of songs and nursery rhymes and share stories with repeated words or phrases to encourage us to join in with retelling them.
