Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of Thomas Bullock

We have a very long Newsletter for you this week! It has been Anti Bullying Week this week and Miss Bell-Tye put a programme together across the whole school and below is a report on each classes' activities.

Nursery

We wore odd socks on Monday and talked all about how each of us are unique in our likes/dislikes, appearances and personalities. Later in the week, we read a story together of 'Kindness Makes us Stronger' by Sophie Beer, discussing how we can be kind to each other in class. We talked further about the importance of using our kind hands, printing these onto a large piece of paper to display in our classroom as a reminder!







Reception

This week we have shared the story of 'Be Kind' by Axel Scheffler and explored the ways in which we can be kind to each other. We discussed and made a mindmap of ideas about what it means to be a kind friend. After this, we created a heart of hearts; we painted the hearts with kindness and added them to our kindness tree. As well as this, we conducted a social experiment using two apples - one we treated kindly and one we didn't! When we cut them open at the end, the kindness apple looked good inside and the apple which didn't have kindness, was bruise and badly damaged! This showed us that our kindness is really



needed to make people feel happy and healthy.

Year 1

Year one have had lots of fun making a noise about bullying and learning all about Antibullying week. We kicked the week off with our Odd Socks Day, celebrating everyone being unique and designing a pair of our own odd socks. On Tuesday we talked about what bullying is and how there are different types of bullying - none of



which are okay! On Wednesday we took part in some role play and put ourselves in the shoes of people in different scenarios where someone was being unkind. We explained how we might

was being unkind. We explained how we might feel if that really happened and how we could help that person - Make A Noise (tell a trusted adult). On Thursday we had a class discussion about how to be a good friend and today is Children in Need! We took part in some Pudsey Bear colouring and dressed in yellow or spots! Loads of fun!





Year 2

Year 2 loved showing off their odd socks on Monday. We have spent lots of time discussing 'making a noise about bullying' and what to do if we spot or experience bullying. We have done some mindfulness colouring to reflect on using our kind words and being a friend to others.





Year 3

This week in Year 3 to raise awareness for anti - bullying week, the children learnt what bullying means and how to prevent it from happening. The children wore odd socks on Monday and watched the odd socks song online, On Tuesday and Wednesday we looked more closely at how we can help others and created posters all about anti-bullying. On Thursday we used our knowledge to complete some anti - bullying activities on purple mash.

Year 4

In Year 4 this week, we have focused a lot of our learning around anti bullying and the importance of being kind! I'm reading stars, we unpicked lots of vocabulary to understand the different types of bullying and the ways it can affect people's lives for a long period of time. In PSHE, we looked further into how simple it is to be kind and caring and that sometimes we do say things we don't mean but to recognise and reflect on those. We spent time making a good hand wreath we're the children wrote qualities on each finger for how to be a good friend.

Year 5

Year 5 talked about what it meant to be bullied and also the difference between this and unkindness, banter and teasing. They looked at the effects of bullying and the children wrote anti-bullying pledges.

The children also choose our Shining Light by voting for a child they felt always showed kind, thoughtful behaviour.

Year 6

Year 6 completed some brilliant kindness wordles.

PARKING

Below are Norfolk County Council's guidelines to parking around schools:

Dos

- Let children out of the car on to the pavement not the road
- Park away from the school
- Set a good example to other drivers and your children; they will learn from you
- Help your children to learn road safety skills
- Encourage other drivers to make the roads around schools a safer place

DON'Ts

- Park your vehicle where it will endanger, inconvenience or obstruct other road users or pedestrians
- Block the school entrance or people's driveways
- Block the road emergency vehicles may need access
- Park on yellow lines or zig zag markings
- Park on the pavement or across dropped kerbs
- Park opposite or within 10m of a junction.
