This Thursday we had a visit by the school's Academy Group Executive Principle (AGEP), who is also an Ofsted Inspector. The purpose was to complete a deep dive, looking closely at the children's learning in our school specifically in Maths. During the visit the learning across school was calm and purposeful, the environment was strong and supportive. The children spoke eloquently using correct mathematical vocabulary about their enjoyment of maths and what they knew. We are pleased to share with you that the visit was extremely positive and in her view the teaching and learning, SEND provision, behaviour and outcomes is Outstanding.

I am delighted to inform you that Mr Johnson, experienced Year 1 teacher at Thomas Bullock and the Science Leader has been appointed to the role of Interim Phase Leader for KS1 following a successful application and interview. This role will officially begin when Miss Newcombe leaves for Maternity Leave at end of this half term. Mr Long, will be taking over her role as Maths Leader and supporting schools in the Mastery Maths programme. Miss Newcombe will be spending time with both teachers over the coming weeks.

Number Day


Mr Johnson's dress up for Number Day, as you can see, was quite unique – wearing a table with two clocks attached and three questions written underneath for his year 1 class:
